A First Grader Comes Home


In 1949, my parents, Bob and Jinnie Hallam, obtained a rental home here in Lockbourne. I was 5 years old that September; therefore, enrolled in the local school in the first grade.

My parents had hoped to purchase property here, however, they were unable to find anything at the time. So, regrettably, we moved from Lockbourne.

My new school was called Schlee located on Harmon Ave., very close to my dad's place for employment, F.W. Slotter Concrete. At first, the school staff didn't want to accept me, since I was only 5 years old. My mom talked them into a 2 week trial run. Apparently Lockbourne & my parents had prepared me well, as my grades exceeded the first graders at Schlee.

Over the years, my family had property in Ohio and Florida. My dad retired in 1976 from Slotter & moved to Florida permanently. At some point in time, I also moved to Florida. Being a true Buckeye at heart, I failed to accept Florida as my home, and relocated back to Ohio.

Community Assistance Program

To assist members of our community at “high risk” by the coronavirus, there will be a temporary implementation of a senior Community Assistance Program.

What is the purpose of the Community Assistance Program?

To create an option for "high risk" community members to have access to essential supplies such as groceries, and household supplies through volunteers.

Who is Community Assistance Program for?

Under recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Governor Mike DeWine and President Donald Trump; those at "high risk" for acquiring coronavirus are urged to avoid densely populated areas such as grocery stores, malls or any assembly of ten or more people.

Community members that fall within the "high risk" category for coronavirus, such as Seniors 60+ years old, and those with preexisting medical conditions (such as respiratory, kidney, heart disease...) and seniors without an immediate support system in place, will qualify for this assistance.

Community members of Obetz, Hamilton Township, Lockbourne, Reese and Shadeville, will be eligible for the Community Assistance Program evaluation.

How does the Community Assistance Program work?

Community members can call the Hamilton Township Fire Department and answer a questionnaire. **Eligible** member's information will be recorded by a fire department employee, who will "pass on" this information to an off-duty volunteer from one of the below mentioned groups.

These volunteers will contact you by phone to set a time to come to your home and pick up the grocery list you have assembled. The community member will also supply the volunteer with cash to purchase from your list.

The member will return to your home with groceries, change (if any) and the receipt of purchase. **Alcohol, tobacco, firearms, personal medications and non-staple items will not be eligible for purchase by the volunteer.**

The community member should have their grocery list and cash ready prior the member's arrival. To limit exposure to both the community member and the volunteer, contact and exchange should take place outside the home environment.

Who are the volunteers helping with this program?

Hamilton Township Fire Department members, Obetz Police Department members, Obetz Administrative staff, and vetted members of the community by the Fire department.
